

Editorial





particularly in low and middle income countries like India, is deeply concerning. Despite being largely preventable through vaccination and regular screening, cervical cancer still accounts for thousands of deaths annually. A concerted effort involving healthcare providers, public awareness and government backed vaccination programmes is crucial to reversing this trend.

Prevalence of Cervical Cancer

Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer among women in India after breast cancer. According to the Global Cancer Observatory (GLOBOCAN 2020), India accounts for nearly 21% of the global cervical cancer burden, with over 1,20,000 new cases and approximately 77,000 deaths annually. The disease primarily affects women in their reproductive and middle-aged years (30–50 years), making it a significant public health concern.

The primary cause of cervical cancer is persistent infection with highrisk types of the Human Papilloma Virus (HPV), especially HPV types 16 and 18, which are responsible for nearly 70% of all cervical cancers. HPV is transmitted mainly through sexual contact.

Other contributing factors include:

- Early onset of sexual activity
- · Multiple sexual partners
- Immunosuppression (e.g., HIV infection)
- Smokina
- Long term use of oral contraceptives
- · Poor genital hygiene
- · Lack of regular Pap smear screening

Signs and Symptoms

Cervical cancer often remains asymptomatic in its early stages, which is why regular screening is vital. As the disease progresses, common symptoms include:

- Abnormal vaginal bleeding, especially after intercourse or between periods
- Foul smelling vaginal discharge
- · Pelvic pain or pain during intercourse
- · Post-menopausal bleeding

In advanced cases, symptoms may include leg pain, swelling, weight loss, and urinary or rectal bleeding due to local invasion.

Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)

HPV is a group of over 100 related viruses, with more than 14 identified as high-risk oncogenic types. HPV infection is extremely common, especially among sexually active individuals. In most cases, the body clears the virus naturally, but persistent infection with high-risk strains can lead to precancerous changes in the cervix, eventually progressing to cancer if untreated.

Prevention and Screening

Primary Prevention:

HPV vaccination is the cornerstone of primary prevention. The Quadrivalent (Gardasil) and Bivalent (Cervarix) vaccines protect against the most common cancer-causing strains (HPV 16 and 18).

India's own indigenously developed vaccine, Cervavac, launched in 2023 is a cost-effective vaccine priced affordably for mass immunization.

Vaccination is recommended for girls aged 9–14 years before sexual debut.

Secondary Prevention:

Routine screening through Pap smears, HPV DNA testing or Visual Inspection with Acetic Acid (VIA) for early detection of pre-cancerous lesions.

WHO recommends screening at least once between ages 30 and 49, especially in low-resource settings.

Tertiary Prevention:

Early treatment of precancerous lesions via cryotherapy, LEEP (Loop Electrosurgical Excision Procedure), on cold knife conization.

Advanced cervical cancer is treated with surgery, chemotherapy and/or radiotherapy.

Importance of the HPV Vaccine

The HPV vaccine is safe, effective, and a game-changer in reducing the incidence of cervical cancer. Clinical trials have shown over 90% effectiveness in preventing HPV related cervical lesions. A widespread immunization program can lead to a substantial decline in cancer incidence within one generation.

Despite its proven efficacy, vaccine uptake in Indian remains low due to lack of awareness, social stigma around sexual health, vaccine hesitancy, cost, and accessibility issues (largely addressed with Cervavac).

Role of Indian Medical Association (IMA)

The Indian Medical Association has signed an MDU with FOGSI (Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India) to train 5000 IMA members for HPV vaccination for prevention and to decrease the cases of cervical cancer.

- Raising public awareness through health camps, educational talks, and media outreach
- Training doctors and healthcare workers on cervical cancer screening techniques and HPV vaccination protocols by holding workshops and webinars and physical CMEs
- Promoting inclusion of HPV vaccine in the Universal Immunization Programme (UIP)
- Advocating for school-based vaccination programmes for adolescent girls
- Collaborating with state governments and NGOs to strengthen rural health infrastructure for cervical cancer screening

I appeal to all IMA members to join this initiative of training for HPV vaccination programme.

Government's Role and Policy Initiatives

The Government of India, in alignment with WHO's global strategy to eliminate cervical cancer by 2030, has taken several measures:

- Inclusion of Cervavac in the National Immunization Programme (initiated in phases from 2024 onward)
- Launch Ayushman Bharat Health and Wellness Centres for accessible screening services
- National Cancer Control Programme (NCCP) initiatives to train ASHAs and ANMs workers for VIA-based screening
- Efforts to create gender-sensitive adolescent friendly health services
- Encourage public-private partnerships for improving coverage and awareness

As clinicians, it is imperative that we educate our patients, support vaccination efforts and promote routine screening to detect early disease. Cervical cancer is preventable, treatable and even eradicable with the right interventions.

By leveraging the combined efforts of medical professionals, government bodies, and civil society, India can significantly reduce the burden of cervical cancer and move toward elimination. The integration of the HPV vaccine into public health policy marks a historic step in this direction but sustained awareness, accessibility, and commitment are key to achieving our goal. Prevention is not just better than cure, it is the only cure for cervical cancer.


