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Editorial



National Doctor's Day is celebrated every year in India on **1st July**, to honour the invaluable contribution of doctors to individual lives and society at large. It serves as a reminder of the dedication, compassion and selfless service rendered by the medical professionals who often place their patients' lives above their own comfort. The day also commemorates the birth and death anniversary of **Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy**, a legendary physician and statesman.

SIGNIFICANCE OF NATIONAL DOCTOR'S DAY

Doctors are the cornerstone of a healthy and functional society. National Doctor's Day is observed to:

- Recognise the relentless efforts and sacrifices made by physicians.
- Promote awareness about the importance of timely and accessible healthcare.
- Encourage empathy and trust in the doctor-patient relationship.
- Inspire the younger generation to take up the medical profession with a service-oriented approach.
- Strengthen trust between doctors and patients.
- Pay homage to **Dr. B. C. Roy**, an icon of medical excellence.

National Doctor's Day was first celebrated in India in **1991** by the **Indian Medical Association (IMA)** on **1st July**. The observance has since evolved into a national tribute to all doctors across urban and rural settings, acknowledging their crucial role, especially in times of public health crises.

The theme for **National Doctor's Day** is "**Behind the Mask: Who Heals the Healers?**" This theme shines a spotlight on the physical, mental and emotional well-being of medical professionals. It reminds society that those who dedicate their lives to caring for others also require rest, support and healthy working environments to manage high stress and burnout.

Life of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy (1st July 1882 – 1st July 1962)

Dr. B. C. Roy was more than just a doctor. He was a visionary, freedom fighter and statesman.

After graduating from Calcutta Medical College, he went to London and became a member of the **Royal College of Physicians (MRCP)** and a **Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (FRCS)** in an extraordinary short span. He became one of the most esteemed physicians in the country and served as the personal doctor to Mahatma Gandhi.

He was elected as the second Chief Minister of West Bengal and served from **1948 to 1962**. Under his leadership, cities like **Durgapur, Kalyani and Bidhannagar** were developed. He was instrumental in establishing the **Indian Medical Association (IMA)** in **1928**. For his exceptional contribution, he was awarded the **Bharat Ratna**, India's highest civilian award, in **1961**. Dr. B. C. Roy's life represents the ideals of a physician—knowledge, compassion, leadership and service to humanity.

The National Doctor's Day is observed through:

- Felicitation ceremonies and awards for doctors.
- Health awareness programmes and medical camps.
- Discussions on healthcare challenges and innovations.
- Educational activities for students and the public.
- Messages of appreciation from patients, organisations and communities.
- Social Media and Media Houses run tributes, interviews and highlight stories of extraordinary doctors.

Doctor - Patient Relationship

A strong doctor-patient relationship is the foundation of effective healthcare.

- **Trust & Communication** – Mutual respect and open communication help in better diagnosis, treatment and compliance.
- **Empathy and Compassion** – Patients value empathy just as much as technical competence.
- **Ethics and Confidentiality** – Doctors are bound by medical ethics, prioritising patient welfare, confidentiality and informed consent.
- **Challenges** – Increasing workload, violence against doctors and misinformation have strained this relationship in recent years, making awareness and reforms even more crucial.

National Doctors' Day is a reminder that medicine is not merely a profession, but a commitment to humanity. It celebrates the dedication of doctors who continue to serve society with knowledge, compassion and courage.

On this day, we honour every doctor who works towards the noble goal of healing and improving lives.

As the President of the Indian Medical Association and even as a person this makes me very sad. It is a big reminder that we need to talk about respect, kindness, and how we behave in public.

1. The Body is Our First Teacher

Before a student can become a doctor and save lives, he has to study the human body. Students do this using a body that someone decides selflessly to donate to science after his death.

When a family gives a loved one's body to a medical college, it is a beautiful, unselfish act. They do it because they want to help the humanity.

For such reasons and many more, we must treat that body with the highest respect, as we call it our "first teacher." Making fun of a body for a quick laugh or for getting more likes on social media is wrong. It hurts the feelings of the family who gave us that gift, and it makes people lose trust in doctors.

2. Being a Doctor is a 24/7 Job

When you choose to become a doctor, you choose a life of helping others. You cannot remain a respectful doctor in the hospital and then make cruel jokes on a stage or on social media.

Qualities of good doctor and what one must avoid

- Speaking with kindness and respect and not making fun of people's bodies for a joke.
- Keeping patient's secrets safe and not posting or saying things that hurt public trust.
- Following strict rules of behavior and not forgetting duties just to become famous online.

3. Learning from Mistakes, Not Bullying

In this particular incidence immediately Seth G S MC & KEM Hosp came into action and started investigation and necessary action.

IMA State and IMA MSN issued a press note condemning the act. The student has also apologized in public as well to the enquiry committee

While what she said was wrong, the online bullying and mean comments sent to her by the public are also wrong. We cannot fix a mistake with anger and hatred. Our goal is to teach her to be a better person and a good doctor and not to destroy her life.

It should not be looked as a momentary lapse in judgment by an individual but it's a wake up call for entire medical fraternity regarding the erosion of medical ethics and professional decorum,

4. Message to Young Students

Whatever you choose to do in life, always remember that respect is the most important thing.

The apron doctor wears is not just white coat but it is a symbol of trust, privacy and dignity. It is a promise to be kind, compassionate and to respect every single human being - living or dead.

Let us learn from this, treat each other with dignity and always choose kindness over a cheap laugh.

3rd & 5th June 2026 : Screening and Oral Health Camps Organized by the Indian Medical Association Mumbai Branch on Occasion of “ World No Tobacco Day” held on Wednesday 3rd June 2026 at F/South Ward Oral Health Camp and Friday 5th June 2026 At G/South Ward Oral Health Camp.

The Indian Medical Association (IMA) Mumbai Branch in association with TATA preventive oncology dept, Narottam Seksaria foundation and Cipla health care organized General Screening and Oral Health Camps in F/South Ward Parel and G/South Wards Prabhadevi. The objective of the programme was to create awareness regarding the harmful effects of tobacco consumption and facilitate the early detection of oral diseases, diabetes mellitus (DM), hypertension (HTN), Obesity, lung capacity by breathometer and other health conditions among the staff of solid waste management dept. The event was attended by Dr. S. G. Shanbhag, Vice presidents, Dr. Pragji Vaja and Dr. Kajal Ahuja, Dr. Sunita Kadam, Dr. Surabhi Vaidya and other members of the Indian Medical Association.

1. F/SOUTH WARD ORAL HEALTH CAMP

Date : 03rd June 2026 (Wednesday)

Venue : F/South Ward Conference Hall, Prabhadevi

Inaugurated at the hands of Asstt Commissioner Mrs. Vrushali Ingole

A total of 34 beneficiaries participated in the camp, comprising 13 males and 21 females. Oral screening was conducted for all attendees.

- Referred for Tobacco cessation centre (TCC) : 12
- TCC screening completed: 12
- Referred to Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH): 3
- 2 Leucoplakia
- 1 Oral submucous fibrosis

General Health Screening Findings

- Known cases of Diabetes Mellitus (DM): 2
- Newly suspected DM cases: 1 (referred to BMC Dispensary/HBT)
- Known cases of Hypertension (HTN): 3

2. G/SOUTH WARD ORAL HEALTH CAMP

Date : 05th June 2026 (Friday)

Venue : G/South Ward Conference Hall, Prabhadevi

Inaugurated at hands of Asstt. Commissioner Mrs. Swapnaja Kshirsagar

A total of 63 beneficiaries attended the camp, including 48 males and 15 females.

Oral Screening Findings

- Total beneficiaries screened: 63
- Referred for Tobacco cessation centre (TCC): 18
- Referred to Tata Memorial Hospital (TMH): 9
- Leucoplakia 8
- Oral submucous fibrosis 1

General Health Screening Findings

- Known cases of Diabetes Mellitus (DM): 15
- Newly suspected DM cases: 4 (referred to BMC Dispensary/HBT)
- Known cases of Hypertension (HTN): 27
- Newly suspected HTN cases: 6 (referred to BMC Dispensary/HBT)
- Overweight individuals identified: 40 (28 males and 12 females)

The screening and oral health camps received an encouraging with a total of 97 beneficiaries screened across both wards. The programme successfully identified individuals requiring further evaluation and treatment for oral health concerns, diabetes, hypertension, and other risk factors. Through awareness generation, screening, and timely referral services, the initiative contributed significantly to the objectives of World No Tobacco Day and promoted preventive healthcare practices among the public.

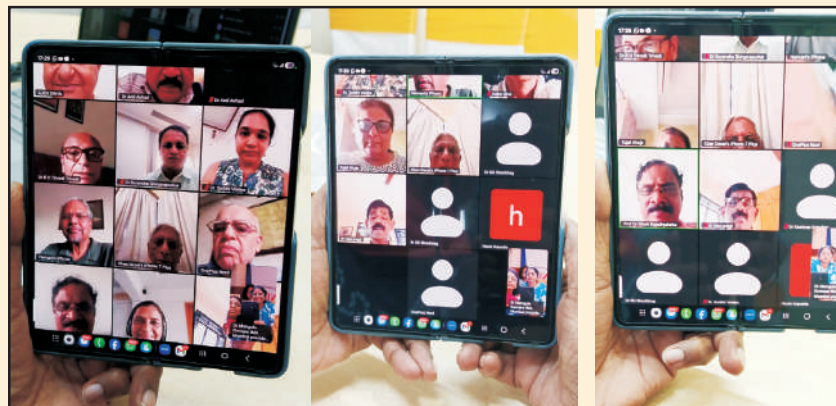

Report of Aao Gaon Chalen Sub – Committee

20th June 2026: Team Aao gaon Chalen team visited **village Khairatwadi** a tribal village near Tara on 20/06/2026.

The team comprised of Dr. Hemant Haldavnekar, Dr. Neela Haldavnekar, Dr. Dinesh Prabhu, Dr. Priya Singanapurkar and Dr. Sunita Kadam. They examined 47 patients almost all were tribals.

The morbidity pattern was as follows hypertension – 5

Diabetes – 2, Anaemia – 14,

Scabies – 2, Tenia – 2, ANC – 2, URTI 3. Rest were body ache and back ache.

Two home visits were done, one was a case of hemiplegia with hypertension and was on drugs, the other was diabetic with amputation done.

Towels were distributed one per each family donated by Dr. Hemant Haldavnekar and Dr. Mrs. Neela Haldavnekar.

Next camp will be decided depending on the rains and the harvest work due by the villagers.
