### F.ditorial

World Alzheimer's Day, observed annually on 21st September, serves as a global platform to raise awareness about Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. With a rapidly ageing population, the incidence of Alzheimer's is rising sharply, posing a major public health challenge. Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of dementia, accounting for



approximately 60-70% of cases worldwide. It is characterized by progressive cognitive decline, functional impairment, and behavioral disturbances. The disease not only impacts patients but also exerts an intense psychological and financial burden on caregivers and society. World Alzheimer's Day 2025 emphasizes the urgent need for early diagnosis, comprehensive management and preventive strategies.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), over 55 million people currently live with dementia globally and this number is projected to reach 139 million by 2050. In India, an estimated 4 to 5 million individuals are affected, with prevalence doubling every 20 years due to increased life expectancy. Alzheimer's is now recognized as one of the top five causes of disability and dependency in the elderly. It affects about 6% of people 65 years and older and women more often than men. The disease is named after German psychiatrist and pathologist Alois Alzheimer, who first described it in 1906. Alzheimer's financial burden on society is large, with an estimated global annual cost of US dollar one trillion. Alzheimer's and related dementias are ranked as the 7th leading cause of death.

#### **Early Signs and Symptoms**

Recognition of prodromal and early Alzheimer's is essential for timely intervention. The first symptoms are often mistakenly attributed to aging or stress. Detailed neuropsychological testing can reveal mild cognitive difficulties up to 8 years before a person fulfills the clinical criteria for diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease. These early symptoms can affect the most complex activities of daily living. The most noticeable deficit is short-term memory loss. Older memories of the person's life and implicit memory are affected to a lesser degree than new facts or memories. Language problems are mainly characterized by a shrinking vocabulary and decreased word fluency leading to a general impoverishment of oral and written language.

- Short-term memory impairment like forgetting conversations, misplacing items.
- Difficulty in problem-solving, planning and managing finances
- Disorientation in time and space
- Behavioral and psychological symptoms like irritability, apathy, anxiety and social withdrawal

#### **Diagnosis**

The diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease is clinical, supported by cognitive testing and ancillary investigations.

- Neurocognitive assessments: Mini-Mental State Examination (MMSE) and Montreal Cognitive Assessment (MoCA).
- Laboratory tests: Thyroid function, Vitamin B12, Syphilis serology,

HIV and Metabolic screening.

- Neuroimaging: (MRI/CT)to exclude secondary causes, hippocampal and medial temporal lobe atrophy are supportive findings.
- Advanced biomarkers:CSF amyloid-β and tau protein and PET imaging (amyloid / tau).

#### **Risk Factors**

- Non-modifiable: Age, Family history and APOΕε4 allele.
- **Modifiable**:Hypertension, Diabetes, Dyslipidemia, Smoking, Obesity, Hearing loss, Social isolation, Depression, Traumatic brain injury and sedentary lifestyle.

#### **Differential Diagnosis**

- Vascular dementia Stepwise cognitive decline, focal neurological deficits
- Dementia with Lewy bodies Fluctuating cognition, visual hallucinations, parkinsonism
- Frontotemporal dementia Early behavioral changes and language impairment
- Reversible causes Hypothyroidism, Vitamin B12 deficiency, Neurosyphilis, Chronic infections and Depression (pseudodementia).

#### **Management and Treatment**

#### **Pharmacological Interventions**

- Cholinesterase inhibitors: (Donepezil, Rivastigmine, Galantamine)
  - → Improve cognition and daily functioning in mild to moderate stages
- NMDA receptor antagonist: (Memantine)
  - → Beneficial in moderate to severe stages
- Emerging disease Modifying therapies
  - $\rightarrow$  FDA approved monoclonal antibodies such as Lecanemab and Donanemab target amyloid pathology through accessibility and long-term benefits remain under evaluation.
- Symptomatic treatments: SSRIs for depression and low-dose antipsychotics for severe behavioral disturbances.

#### Non-Pharmacological Interventions

- Cognitive rehabilitation, memory aids, and structured routines.
- Physical activity, balanced diet, music therapy, occupational therapy.
- Patient and caregiver education, psychological support, and community engagement.

#### **Supportive and Palliative Care**

As the disease progresses, multidisciplinary care becomes crucial, focusing on fall prevention, nutrition, management of comorbidities and caregiver burnout prevention Prevention and Risk Reduction: Evidence suggests that up to40% of dementia cases may be preventable through risk factor modification.

#### Preventive strategies include:

- Optimal control of hypertension, diabetes and cholesterol
- Regular physical exercise
- Adherence to Mediterranean / DASH diet
- Addressing hearing impairment early with aids.
- Encouraging lifelong learning, social interactions, and mental stimulation
- Promoting mental health and head injury prevention

World Alzheimer's Day 2025 underscores the urgent need for clinician-driven awareness, early diagnosis, and comprehensive management of Alzheimer's disease. Although curative treatment remains elusive, a combination of pharmacological therapy, lifestyle interventions, and caregiver support can significantly improve quality of life. Collaborative efforts involving healthcare providers, policymakers, and society are vital to reduce the growing burden of this devastating disease.
